ROLL CALL

Commission members in attendance: Ann Polumbus, Gay Warren, Teresa Harbaugh, Douglas Smooke, Councilor VanderWerf. Employees present: Karen Proctor, Director of Finance, Pamela Broyles, Administrative Assistant.

CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Polumbus called the meeting to order at 8:35 a.m.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

There was no audience participation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Doug Smooke moved to approve the July 30, 2012 minutes. Ms. Gay Warren seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS**Review Rady Barn Art Show**

The art show at the Rady Barn is scheduled for September 15, 2012. There will be a pre-party at 5:30 p.m. to honor Catherine Anderson and the Art Commission is included. The artists who will be participating in the silent auction were encouraged to have pieces priced at \$1,000 or less per the Commission's agreement. The artist will receive 70% of the sold item and the Art Commission will receive 30%.

In addition, some artists will bring pieces that will be displayed in a different location that can be priced any way they want. The artist will receive 85% of the proceeds from these art sales and the Art Commission will receive 15%.

Ms. Polumbus reported that the event will have music, food and drinks. She said the silent auction will be set up outside and the extra pieces will be displayed inside the barn.

Councilor VanderWerf cautioned that the pieces may need to be moved inside depending on weather. She said the pictures don't stay on the easels very well if there is any wind at all.

Ms. Polumbus added that several pieces will be displayed on tables.

Ms. Polumbus asked Ms. Harbaugh to put together some type of brochure about the Art Commission to have available at the event.

Ms. Polumbus suggested ordering a vinyl sign with the Art Commission's logo to be placed on the tables.

Ms. Harbaugh will work on the next article for the Crier and will include the art show in her article.

NEW BUSINESS

Ms. Warren reported that she was recently informed about the Scientific and Cultural District (SCFD) organization. The SCFD is an organization where people can apply for money for art in their communities.

Mr. Smooke said he is familiar with the program and has a connection with the person who runs the program. He agreed to make contact with her to get additional information.

Ms. Warren stated that most of the deadlines to apply for funding are around March.

Ms. Polumbus suggested going to the SCFD website and downloading the application that will need to be completed.

Councilor VanderWerf asked the commission if they are interested in being judges for the children's art again this year that will take place in October. The Commission agreed and Councilor VanderWerf will send an email with the details.

Ms. Harbaugh suggested that the Commission might start thinking about art for the new Public Safety building that will be completed at the end of this year.

Ms. Polumbus suggested adding some landscaping around the Sundown sculpture in front of the Village Center so she looks better proportioned.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 8:57 a.m. The next Art Commission meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 17, 2012.


