Roll Call

Call to Order

Ms. Polumbus called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

How to capitalize on energy created from the Duncan event

Ms. Polumbus reviewed the additional contributions made to the Art Commission through the Duncan event.

The Commission discussed the importance of creating a wish list of ideal sites since people seemed concerned with location. The Commission agreed that for future art the site needs to be picked before the art.

The Commission discussed the following options:

- Permanent sites for art should be near the Village Center. Footprints of buildings at the Village Center could change.
- Number one priority is in front of Joint Public Safety Facility
- Denver Water park on the SE corner of Quincy and Holly
- Volunteer Park off Hampden (around the perimeter)
- Can put a large piece of art in Woodie Hollow Park
- Quincy and Clarkson has good visibility
- Possible location for Beaver sculpture next to bridge in Dahlia Park
- The entry feature at Holly and Bellevue. Have a bird coming out of the entry feature. Could also put a wall sculpture or mosaic on the wall.

General Discussion

Commission agreed to meet with Christophe and ask Sally Duncan to attend the meeting. Ask about possible loans and possible artists.

The Commission discussed sending a letter and map to developers to educate them and ask for ideas.

Ms. Harbaugh stated that artist Peter Roosevelt would like to do an art show and donate 100% of the proceeds to the CHVAC. The Commission discussed holding the art show in the Community Development room and will look into adding a hanging system to display art in the room.

The Commission discussed the idea of putting a map with the proposed art locations and a questionnaire with the Commission's ideas in the Village Crier asking Villagers to give feedback and list the top three sites. Information on making donations could also be included.

Future Items

The Commission discussed forming a friends group to help with events. The Commission agreed to table the idea until the resolution is approved through City Council.


The Commission discussed the importance of enlarging the group by two. They agreed it is important to think about what types of skills the Art Commission is looking for.

Adjournment


There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 9:40 a.m. The next Art Commission meeting is scheduled for Monday, July 29, 2013.
