Cherry Hills Village resident named the National Leukemia & Lymphoma Society MAN OF THE YEAR

What happens when community leaders across the country devote 10 weeks of their time and energy to raise funds to find cures for cancer? Records are broken. The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's (LLS) Man & Woman of the Year national campaign winners raised a record-breaking combined total of more than \$900,000 for LLS's goal to find cures for blood cancers and ensure that patients have access to lifesaving treatments.

"The Man & Woman of the Year (MWOY) campaign is truly a unique

fundraising campaign that differentiates LLS from other non-profits. By engaging influential community leaders across the country, Man & Woman of the Year taps into the spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship that has allowed LLS to achieve great success in investing in ground breaking research to advance cancer cures," said Louis J. DeGennaro, Ph.D., LLS President and Chief Executive Officer.

Jim Chrisman is the Senior Vice President of Forest City Stapleton, Inc. in Denver. He has been a longtime supporter of LLS and, before participating in MWOY, was a Board of Trustees Member since 2014. As a blood cancer survivor himself, Chrisman knows firsthand the importance of raising funds for blood cancer research. He became the beneficiary of a new treatment protocol

Chrisman's team and the LLS Staff surprise Jim with the announcement that he was named National Man of the Year after raising a total of \$419,399.

and underwent a successful bone marrow transplant. During his MWOY campaign, he secured over 60 sponsors and ended up raising more money than any other Man & Woman of the Year candidate in Rocky Mountain history.

Chrisman didn't want to be identified with something as negative as cancer; he wanted to use the opportunity to leverage a bad experience into something more positive. His ultimate goal was to

expand the goals of LLS, to continue research and finding cures or progressions in treatment. In his speech at the LLS gala, he spoke about how he was contacted by a woman whose husband had the same disease as Chrisman about five years ago, but did not have access to the same treatment Chrisman did because it hadn't evolved yet. "One point I made at the gala was that research is happening so quickly that the dollars people give are meaningful dollars.

It is sometimes hard to associate your giving with a direct benefit so I thought it was important to point out how direct giving can be; that in five year's time I had a protocol that wasn't readily available then. Five years from now, with these dollars that were donated today, others may have protocols in place that will help save more lives."

Mayor Musings...

Although this is published in August, I am required to meet a publishing deadline in July. I began to write an article about the ongoing design highlights of Meade Park, the wonderful farmers' market scheduled for August 19th, and a few words about the open house at our Public Safety Building; then the nation's headlines became dominated by killings. Killings of African American police suspects and killings of Police Officers themselves while in the line of duty.

What has followed these events has been rhetoric which, in my opinion, has not been particularly helpful. Saying that our officers in blue are supported by our community, is great and fairly obvious, but does not remove the targets from their backs. Saying that people of color, especially our youth, are subject to systemic racism, again fairly obvious, doesn't make them safe.

Huge strides have been made in our communities, but problems do not just disappear, and they do not solve themselves. Many times there is no quick solution, but moving the ball forward is better than it rolling back. Whether your political leanings are on the right or the left, nothing gets solved by finding fault with everyone and everything. We are a community of educated, dedicated citizens and many of us are business or community leaders. What you say reverberates; please speak with clarity, knowledge and most of all **RESPECT.**

HIGH LINE CANAL TRAIL RESURFACING PROJECT

In the month of August 2016, the City of Cherry Hills Village Public Works Department will be resurfacing the entire 3.2 mile stretch of High Line Canal trail. The project will consist of installing a new layer of granite sand crusher fine material. The new layer of material will remove the large ruts and depressions that present safety hazards for users and improve the trail surface. The overall goal of the project is to keep users safe, improve the appearance and extend the useful life of the High Line Canal trail for many years to come. SHARROWS

Shared Lane
Arrows = Sharrows

Cherry Hills Village and Englewood have been working cooperatively on the resurfacing of Clarkson Street, as this road is within both jurisdictions. After this project is completed, new markings on the road will be installed called sharrows. Clarkson Street has long been recognized on the Denver Regional Bike Map as a "Shared Bike Route" so these new markings will be used to raise awareness and remind drivers to share the road with bicyclists. Shared-lane markings are used to:

- Assist cyclists with positioning in a shared lane with on-street parallel parking in an effort to reduce the chance of a bicyclist impacting an open door of a parked vehicle. (Englewood side)
- Assist cyclists with positioning in lanes that are too

narrow for a motor vehicle and a bicycle to travel side by side within the same traffic lane. (Cherry Hills Village side)

- Alert motorists that bicyclists are likely to be within travel lanes.
- Encourage safe passing of bicyclists by motorists.

Studies have shown that streets with shared lane arrows increase separation between vehicles and cyclists and can decrease accidents. These markings do not change the rules or responsibilities of motorists or cyclists, but simply raise awareness and increase safety.

WE'RE ALL EARS

Hearing is one of the five senses. It is a complex process of picking up sound and attaching meaning to it. The ability to hear is critical to understanding the world around us.



So, how do we hear? The ear can be divided into three parts leading up to the brain – the outer ear, the middle ear and the inner ear. The brain then interprets these electrical signals as sound. Over time, we can develop hearing loss from a breakdown anywhere in our auditory system from ear wax to nerve loss.

How common is hearing loss? Hearing loss has become very prevalent today with more than 30% of people over age 65 have some type of hearing loss. According to the American Speech and Hearing Association, adults should have their hearing screened every three years beginning at age 50.

If I don't pass my hearing screening, what's next?

The first step is to get a complete hearing test to gain an understanding of how you are hearing. If hearing loss is determined, there are many treatment options typically involving hearing aids. Hearing aids are very different from the hearing aids your grandparents wore. The focus is on comfort and cosmetics without sacrificing quality of sound.

Why do I have hearing loss? Noise-induced hearing loss is usually gradual and painless but, unfortunately, permanent. Once damaged, the hearing nerve and the sensory nerve cells do not repair. Genetics also play a significant role with our hearing. If a parent, grandparent, or a sibling suffers from hearing loss, it increases your risk of developing hearing loss (ASHA.org).

What's my first step? Schedule a hearing screening or hearing test with a hearing care professional to start your journey to better hearing health.
