### **ROLL CALL**

### **CALL TO ORDER**

Co-Chair Schmidt called the meeting to order at 10:12 a.m.

### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

#### **John Meade Park Permanent Sculpture**

Kendall Peterson, ThereSquared LLC, summarized the March 11<sup>th</sup> Parks, Trails and Recreation meeting; PTRC wanted a large sculpture with a connection to the landscape and Village history by an artist of repute; they did not like the examples of Kevin Box sculpture and did like the example of Joshua Wiener sculpture; a couple of PTRC members were interested in bronze human figures to connect the Village to mountain towns. She stated it had been a positive meeting; involving PTRC every step of the way was wise in order to avoid them feeling surprised; it was also important to stress that CHVAC is the art commission and the ultimate decision was up to CHVAC; she suggested including a couple members of PTRC in the decision process; she suggested CHVAC could put a survey in the Crier to determine public support for a more contemporary piece versus a more realistic piece.

Co-Chair Schmidt added PTRC did not express opposition to the proposed locations around the upper pond; PTRC was supportive of one large piece rather than multiple smaller pieces.

The Commission discussed deciding on a budget first or picking a sculpture to fundraise for; local, regional, national, or international artists. The Commission asked Ms. Peterson to present sculptures of the appropriate scale at different price points at the next meeting to help them make some decisions on criteria. Ms. Peterson asked the Commission to research sculptures they liked and felt passionate about as well.

The Commission discussed the prohibitive expense involved with installing a sculpture in one of the ponds.

### Open Studios


Commissioner Moore reported she was in contact with the Greenwood Village residents about their open studio event, Women of Steele, which would be held September 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> this year, followed by the Curtis Center for the Arts event Art on the Green; they used golf carts sponsored by local real estate agents to go between studios. She suggested CHVAC could coordinate to have an event at City Hall with local artists. She noted CHVAC would have to commit to the plans before May 30<sup>th</sup> in order to meet the deadlines for the Women of Steele's postcards and mailings. She stated not everyone wanted members of the public exploring their homes so having an event at City Hall might be more appealing.

Coordinator Black noted the Car Show was scheduled for September 10<sup>th</sup> but September 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> were available for a CHVAC event.

The Commission agreed to get a report from Commissioner Smith about interest from resident artists.

### ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Morrow left the meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 11:01 a.m. due to lack of quorum.
